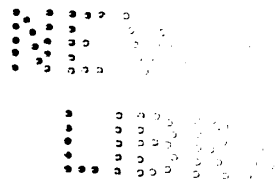

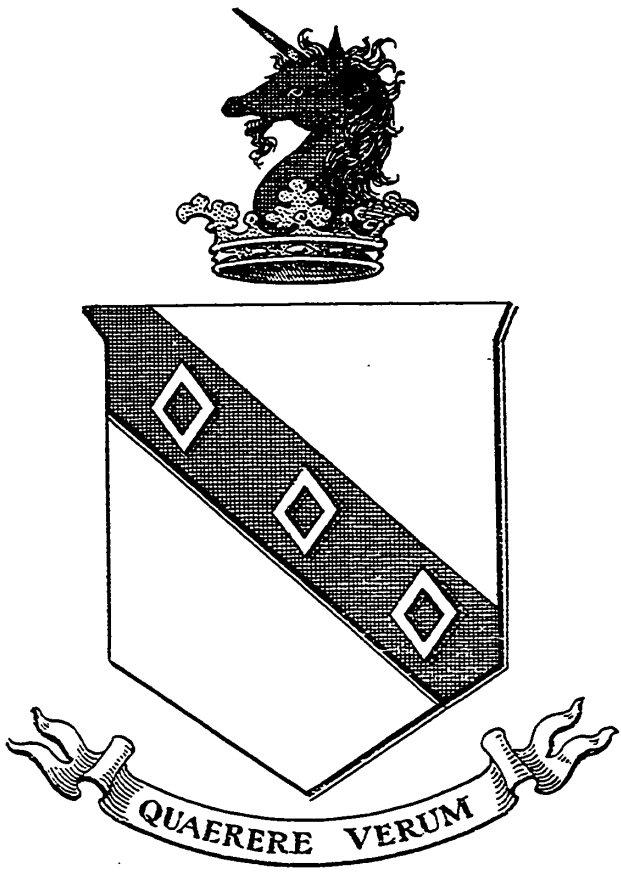

## CARLETON.

### ORIGIN AND MEANING OF THE NAME.

The name is probably taken from one of the many parishes, townships, etc., of England, there being more than twenty of that name. Reference:—Lower, Patronymica Britannica.

### COAT OF ARMS.

(SURREY, BEDFORDSHIRE, LINTON, CAMBRIDGESHIRE AND LONDON.)

ARMS:—Argent on a bend, sable, three mascles of the first, (same as Viscount Carleton).

CREST:—Out of a ducal coronet, or, a unicorn's head, sable, the horn twisted of the first and second.

MOTTO:—Quaerere verum :—To seek the truth.

### HERALDIC EXPLANATIONS.

BEND:—A figure formed by two parallel lines, drawn from the dexter chief to the sinister base. It is one-third of the field in width.

MASCLE:—A perforated lozenge.

LOZENGE:—A diamond square.

UNICORN:—An imaginary animal with the body of a horse, but with cloven hoofs, and a tail like a lion's. It is adorned with a long, twisted horn projecting from its forehead, and on its chin and legs are tufts of hair.

OF THE FIRST:—Means of the first color of the shield or of the crest.

OF THE SECOND:—Means of the second color of the shield or of the crest.

TINCTURES OR COLORS:—Sable, Heraldic word for black. Argent, Heraldic word for white or silver. Or, Heraldic word for gold.

## BRIEF.

On the following pages will be found the lineage of Horace Milton Carlton, giving the line of Joshua Carlton, his father, back to the time of Edward I., 1239-1307; also of Caroline Wheeler, his mother, to the time of their departure from England, 1640, and showing a revolutionary ancestor in Phineas Wheeler.

A colonial ancestor in Benjamin Kimball, on the father's side, also appears.

Notes of S. W. Carlton and data of the town clerk of Rowley are printed in the back part of this pamphlet.

The within lines of record were compiled by H. M. Carlton of Colorado Springs, Colorado, assisted by the Genealogical Bureau of New York City, New York.

10. Edward Carleton, Gentleman, fifth son of John of Brightwell; was Lord of the Manor of East Clarendon, Surrey, in 1562, and presented to the living in 1571. He was tenth in descent from Adam de Carleton of Lincoln and Oxford Family. From him descended the Carletons of Massachusetts. He had five sons, one of whom was the father of Edward Carleton who was in Rowley in 1638. He married Mary Bigley of Bigbye, of Cobham, County of Surrey.
11. George Carleton; had a son Edward who was the resident of Rowley, mentioned above.

## CARLETON.

LINE OF HORACE MILTON CARLETON, COLORADO SPRINGS, COLORADO.

I. EDWARD CARLETON, derived from the Carletons of Chertsey, Surrey, England, settled at Rowley, Massachusetts, in 1638. He was a prominent man in the affairs of Rowley, and a Freeman there in 1642. In 1643 he owned a three-acre house-lot and was one of four who made the survey of the town that same year. Before the year 1656 he returned to England with his wife and children. His wife Eleanor, whom he married in England, was probably the daughter of Sir Thomas Denton. His children were:

John, born in England, probably about 1630.

Edward, born in Rowley, Massachusetts, August 28, 1639. (The first child born in Rowley.)

Mary, born in Rowley, April 2, 1642.

Elizabeth, born in Rowley, January 20, 1644.

2. JOHN CARLETON, the son of Edward Carleton and Eleanor (Denton?) Carleton; was born in England, probably, about 1630. Came with his parents to Rowley, Massachusetts. Soon after the return of his parents, brothers and sisters to England, his father sent him back to Rowley to settle up his affairs.\*

\*J. C. Papers, Probate office, Volume 2, Page 394, contains petition of Christopher Babbage and Hannah his wife, dated November 27, 1678: —“Whereas Mr. Edward Carlton sometime of Rowley, left an estate in New England when he left the country, some of which he sent his son John with letter of attorney to get, but some yet remains, therefore prays the court to appoint some of our relations, Jeremiah or Nehemiah Jewett adm's., that they may get said remainder for the children of said Hannah, relict of said John Carlton dec'd, the only heirs to such estate.” The petition was granted.

He had the title of "Mr.," in Haverhill, Massachusetts, afterwards changed to "Lieut." He married Hannah Jewett, daughter of Joseph Jewett, Esq., and Mary (Mallinson) Jewett, but died when comparatively a young man, in Haverhill, November 22, 1668. His widow afterwards married, in Salem, August 5, 1676, Christopher Babbage. Hannah Jewett was the grand-daughter of Edward Jewett and Mary (Taylor) Jewett of Bradford, West Riding, Yorkshire, England. The children of John Carleton and Hannah (Jewett) Carleton were:

John, born 1658, Married Hannah Osgood.

Joseph, born in Haverhill, Massachusetts, March 21, 1662 or 1663. Married Abigail Osgood.

Edward, born in Haverhill, Massachusetts, March 22, 1664 or 1665. Married Elizabeth Kimball.

Thomas, born in Haverhill, Massachusetts, November 1, 1667.

3. EDWARD CARLETON, son of John Carleton and Hannah (Jewett) Carleton, was born in Haverhill, Massachusetts, March 22, 1664 or 1665. He lived in Bradford and Haverhill, Massachusetts, and married Elizabeth Kimball, daughter of "Cornet" Benjamin Kimball and Mary (Hazeltine) Kimball (See Kimball record). Edward Carleton was killed by an Indian in 1711. His children were:

Edward, born in Bradford, February 20, 1690 or 1691.

Benjamin, born in Bradford, April 23, 1693.

Nehemiah, born in Bradford, Massachusetts, April 15, 1695.

Aaron, born June 12, 1697.

Elizabeth.

Abner, born in Haverhill, October 25, 1699.

Hannah, born in Haverhill, December 2, 1701; died the following January.

Ebenezer, born in Bradford, Massachusetts, December 22, 1704.

4. NEHEMIAH CARLETON, son of Edward Carleton and Elizabeth (Kimball) Carleton, was born in Bradford, Massachusetts, April 15, 1695. He was an extensive land holder in Bradford and Methuen, Massachusetts. He married Elizabeth — and had the following children:

James, born May 29, 1726.

Sarah, born August 12, 1728.

Nehemiah, born December 15, 1730.

Bezaleel, born January 17, 1732 or 1733.

Stephen, born February 1, 1735 or 1736.

Ebenezer, born March 16, 1738.

5. BEZALEEL CARLETON, son of Nehemiah and Elizabeth — Carleton, was born in Bradford, Massachusetts, January 17, 1732 or 1733. He married Sarah —. His children were:

David, born February 1, 1764.

Alles, daughter, born February 3, 1765.

Jacob, born March 2, 1767.

Jedediah, born —, died when five years old.

Nehemiah.

6. NEHEMIAH CARLETON, son of Bezaleel and Sarah — Carleton, was born probably in Bradford, though not recorded there. He married Lydia Hall, who died in Bradford, March 22, 1842, aged 68 years. His children were:

Isaac, born May 13, 1801, in Salem, New Hampshire.  
Married Mary Carleton.

Joshua, born January 9, 1803. Married Caroline Wheeler.

Lydia Webster, born June 6, 1805. Married Nathaniel Carleton.

Jedediah Perkins, born March 21, 1799, in Salem, New Hampshire. Married Almira Wheeler.

Sarah, born August 28, 1810. Married George Shute.

Mary Hall, born December 29, 1797, in Salem, New Hampshire. Married James Richardson of Dracut, Massachusetts.

7. JOSHUA CARLETON, son of Nehemiah Carleton and Lydia (Hall) Carleton, was born in Bradford, Massachusetts, January 9, 1803. Lived in Bradford, Massachusetts, and Warren, Illinois. He married Caroline Wheeler, daughter of Phineas Wheeler of Concord, Massachusetts, about 1827 (See Wheeler record). His children were:

Albert, born April 26, 1831.

Sophronia, born May 29, 1834.

Charles W., born April 2, 1837.

Gilbert, born January 24, 1839.

Henry, born April 4, 1841.

Horace Milton, born October 29, 1843.

8. HORACE MILTON CARLETON, son of Joshua Carleton and Caroline (Wheeler) Carleton, was born in Bradford, Massachusetts, October 29, 1843. Lives in Colorado Springs, Colorado. He married Amelia Chloe Lewis, the daughter of Rev. Edward Dodge Lewis and Mary P. (Woodworth) Lewis, at Warren, Illinois, April 13, 1865. His children are:

Albert Eugene, born February 20, 1866.

Mary Edna, born July 1, 1868.

Alice Maud, born November 18, 1870.

Leslie Gilbert, born June 20, 1873.

Ella Winifred, born April 25, 1878.
