In Worcester Registry of Deeds, book 26, page 536, is the record of a deed from Timothy Green, printer, and Jonas Leonard, innholder, of Boston, guardians of Eunice, Elizabeth and James Barber, minors, and children of Hezekiah Barber late of Boston, blacksmith, to John Moffatt of said Boston, printer, of land in Stoughton and Dorchester, Mar. 31, 1750.

He d. Oct. 13, 1757 and Nov. 18 of the same year, Abigail Leonard, widow, filed a bond and made application for appointment as administratrix to settle the estate of her deceased husband, Jonas Leonard, innholder.

It is not known whether he had any children.

ANDREW LEONARD,⁴ (*Moses*,³ *John*,² *Solomon*,¹) brother of the preceding, b. in Worcester, Nov. 20, 1719; m. 1, Mar. 7, 1744-5 Dorothy Stevens who d. about 1757 and he m. 2, June 13, 1758 Hannah Pierce of Rutland (dan. of Samuel Pierce who d. at Zoar, Nov. 4, 1775). We have the record of the births of sixteen children all born within the limits of the original town of Rutland, a majority of them in "Rutland West Wing" which in 1762 was incorporated as the town of Oakham. His father, Moses Leonard, Senior, deeded him a tract of land in the south part of Rutland, Feb. 9, 1745, on which he settled at the time of his first marriage. May 18, 1749, for £1300, his brother Moses sold him a farm probably adjoining, and at the same date he mortgaged it to Stephen Gates of Rutland. Sept. 9, 1760, his father deeded him one-half of the farm of 250 acres on which he had been living in "West Wing,"—he "now living in Rutland District"—and "5 $\frac{3}{4}$ acres more in West Wing." He probably returned there soon after.

The exact date of his death has not been ascertained: it was "about 1805," Capt. Tomlinson, a son of Rev. Daniel Tomlinson the first pastor of the Congregational Church organized here, stated in 1883, (he then being 90) that "he remembers well old Mr. Andrew Leonard and wife"; that "he then lived in the east part of the town, built a house by the side of a ledge of rocks: short logs were used for seats."

In the deeds of purchase and sale of lands he is called "husbandman," or "yeoman." His second wife, Hannah, died Aug. —, 1813, aged 75 years.

JOHN LEONARD,⁴ (*Josiah*,³ *John*,² *Solomon*,¹) oldest son of Josiah and Marjoram (Washburn) Leonard of Bridgewater, b. — : m. Naomi Curtis Nov. 23, 1732. He was a member of the First Church in Bridgewater (propounded Aug. 9, admitted Aug. 23, 1730) : and she of the Second Church and were both dismissed by letters to the church in Sutton in 1741.
