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[Arrangement of 1870.]

At a court of Common Pleas held at the Court House in the village of Batavia, in and for the county of Genesee, in the State of New-York; on the sixteenth day of June of the term of June 1827, being a Court of Record, in pursuance of the 41st article of the Constitution of the state of New-York, which has unlimited jurisdiction, keeps records of its proceedings, and has immemorably exercised the power of fine and imprisonment.

Present, the Hon. John A. Jones, Richard Smalley, Isaac

Wilson, & Moses Hayden Judges

GENESEE COUNTY, ss.—On this sixteenth day of June 1827, personally appeared in open Court, (being a Court of Record,) Timothy Lowell aged sixty six years, resident of the town of Sweden — in said county, who being first duly sworn according to law; doth, on his oath, declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows:—

One year and eight months, served in Capt. Jones' Company in Col. James Reed's Regiment New Hampshire line, that he was discharged at Mount Independence in the fall of 1776. That his declaration was dated the — day of — 1818 and his Certificate is Numbered 9952 — — —

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States, on the eighteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, and that I have not, since that time, by gift sale or in any manner whatever, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war," passed on the eighteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts, or debts, due to me; nor have I any income, other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed.

### Schedule

Real Estate. I have a Bond for a Deed of Ninety four acres of Land Situate in the Town of Sweden on the LeRoy Bayard & Co's Tract. I have paid the amount of the Bond to Widow Pease, but the Land is forfeited from him to the Original Owners. There is about six acres improved, and a small Log House and a small Barn built on the same. —

a crippled hand and infirmity he is not able to do  
any hard labor, he has a wife named Mary aged fifty  
seven years, a weakly woman not able to do any  
thing except necessaries about house, that he has  
no Children living with him - Timothy Lowell

in the town of Cambridge in the State of Massachusetts  
sets in the Company of Continental forces under the  
command of Captain Benjamin Mearns in the Regiment  
commanded by Col. James Reed of the Brigade of  
General Sullivan for eight months, that he continued in  
such service during the said eight months and was  
thereby ~~honorably~~ <sup>honorably</sup> discharged, that he  
was in the battle at Bunker's Hill - that thereafter dis-  
posed further says that he afterwards, in the month  
of January 1776 again entered into the service of the  
United States for one year under the command of  
Captain Jones in the same Regiment and Brigade  
that he continued in such service during the said time  
of one year, excepting about three months of the  
said time he was sick and his brother was a substitute  
in the said service in his place - and at the ex-  
piration of his said time of one year was again  
and honorably discharged from service at Mount Ple-  
asance on the shore of Lake Champlain, that he  
is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of  
the assistance of his Country for support - and that  
he has no other evidence now in his power of his said  
services -

Deponent is informed the said Lowell has paid  
two hundred Dollars, and believes the Debt the  
said Lowell owes to be about fifty Dollars, that  
the said Lowell's personal property consists of one  
cow & calf, six or eight sheep & some household  
furniture worth about twenty Dollars, that the  
said Lowell has a wife & nine children all of  
age & none of the children living with him from  
whom he has derived some assistance, but  
they are not in circumstances to afford him  
much and that the said Lowell is subject to  
the rheumatism & not able to do much work.
